Our autumn play is a comedy where four managers on a training course find that life can have its challenges.

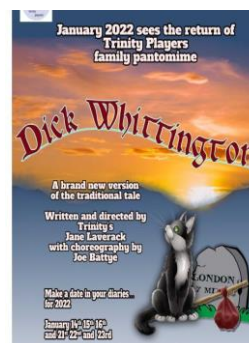


Running 7th – 10th September 7.15pm
